



Kenneth H. Sullivan

March 24, 1922 - November 9, 2007

Kenneth H. Sullivan, 85, of Solsberry, passed away at 11:30 A.M. on Friday November 9, 2007 at Garden Villa in Bloomington.

Born March 24, 1922 in Greene County, he was the son of Roy M. and Charlotte "Lottie" (Combs) Sullivan.

He worked in maintenance for Eastern schools retiring in 2003 after 33 years of service. He was also a farmer and a heavy equipment operator. He was a WW II veteran earning a bronze star and also fought in the battle of the buldge.
