Leonard Wayne McIntosh, 88, of Bloomfield passed away Sunday January 26, 2014 at Lyons Health & Living Center.

Born June 30, 1925 in Greene County, Indiana the son of Webster D. and Luna (Bland) McIntosh.

Wayne was a truck driver and a heavy equipment mechanic, he worked at the Bloomfield Silo Company for 20 years and the old gravel pit. He was a U.S. Army Veteran of WWII serving in the 3rd Division, he was a member of the Tulip Church of God.
