Tom A. Vlaskamp, 74, of Bloomfield formerly of Muncie, went home to be with his Lord and Savior on Saturday, April 7, 2012 at I.U. Health Methodist Hospital in Indianapolis after an auto accident in Greene County. Tom was born in Muncie on October 19, 1937 to Earl and Edna (Hawk) Vlaskamp. He was a graduate of Muncie Central High School, Tom worked for the U.S. Postal Service for over 30 years as a Postmaster in Solsberry.
