“Vince was a good man, as I knew him, he would give anyone the shirt off of his back. He always had a smile on his face and a story to tell. He came to live with Larry and I after Tommy passed away. I had never had to take care of anyone like this before so little did I know what we were up against. I grew to have a whole different respect for caregivers and all the hard work they had to put in taking care of other people or a loved one. Vince and I had quite the rapport, he liked to smile for the camera and I liked taking his pictures. I loved him with all my heart, and soul. If you had ever met Vince and never was shown his ring or hat then something was wrong, that was always one of the first things he would show a person if he were in public, even if it meant waving the hat clear across the restaurant at someone. Sometimes he would wait til we slipped away from the table and tag someone just to show them his military ring Johnnie got him or the hat we had got him. He was quite the person we had grown to appreciate and love. He even took one of our cats under his wing and decided she was his. When he referenced her he called her, "some cat." He never called her by name, even though her name was Poe. She always stayed close by his side, never minding the numerous amount of times that he ran over her tail with his wheelchair. Even then she still went back to him for more attention. Another one of his favorite pastimes was to sit in front of our living room window or outside on a pretty day and count cars. He usually never got past 12 before he fell fast asleep, only to be awoken by one of us nudging his wheelchair to bring him back inside. As Vince loved it when we gave him a chore, like folding his own clothes or feeding the "cat", this is what made him feel useful and happy. Strangely enough not long after Vince went into the hospital, Poe came up missing. We are still unaware of her whereabouts. She has never ventured off the property before. We have looked high and low for her many times. We swear that, when Vince went she went with him. She was ill, but maybe we didn't know how much suffering she was in, we know she missed him terrible, she always seemed to be searching for him. We miss them both. We would like to believe she's with him now and their finally together again at last.
