Wilma L. Hugunin, 89, of Bloomfield, passed away 9:00 p.m. Monday, August 25, 2008 at the Washington Nursing Center in Washington.

Born April 4, 1919 in Odon, she was the daughter of Ernest Walter and Elma (Dowden) Hugunin.

She served her country in World War II in the Women's Army Air Corps 8th division, serving in England, France, and Germany. She was a buyer and designer in the fashion industry for I. Magnin in Chicago and San Francisco. She was a member of the Bloomfield American Legion, VFW, and the Air Force Association. She was a 1937 graduate of Odon High School.

Surviving relatives include: three sisters, Opal Davidson of Kalona, Iowa, Mae Stuffle of Loogootee, and Helen Boling of Bloomfield; and several nieces and nephews.
